Rich and Susan Clem were in the Indianola Art Crawl, May 22.

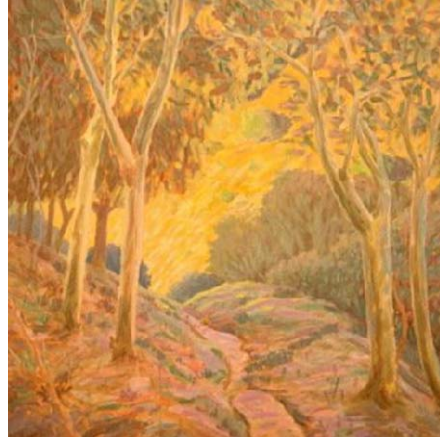
